Upcoming shows range from world-class harmonica player Espanola Slim bluegrass group Whiskey Jack, from the pop-rock of Scott and Simon to the R&B of John Mays.

"I like to keep the variety and calibre of our guests up," he said.

"I'm looking for people who are really going to challenge us every week."

So who's his idea of a dream guest? He says he doesn't have one in specific, though he says Mark Lalama has been a great addition in the past.

The band still plays every Saturday night at the Anchorage.

It's something of a opportunity, Goldberger said, in that it offers a steady Saturday night gig, a chance to stretch personal musical boundries on a regular basis, and a friendly atmosphere for performances.
